Description

Gibson created this 1957 Flying V prototype in response to resellers who thought the company's designs were throwbacks to an outdated era. After experimenting with different shapes, they settled on a guitar design that included a triangular body with a triangular cutout at its bottom end. The resulting V-shaped guitar had two tailfins like a 1957 Chevrolet car and was an immediate attentiongetter. But even though it fascinated the public, the guitar design proved too radical, and less than 100 were sold in the first few years of its release. A decade later, the Flying V increased in popularity as it was played by high-profile musicians such as Bluesman Albert King, guitarist Jimi Hendrix, and Dave Davies of the Kinks.
